

LIGHTING OF THE FIRST ADVENT CANDLE (HOPE)

Voice #1: Today is the first Sunday of Advent, so we light the first candle of our Advent wreath: the candle of Hope

Voice #2: Twenty-five centuries ago, in a time not much different from our own when the Israelites had little hope for the future of their country

or their people, the prophets called to God to come to the people and to make things right. They told the people -- and us -- that messiah would come as a new hope in the midst of suffering.

Voice #1: Their prayers were answered with the birth of Jesus, also called Emmanuel, a Hebrew word that means "God with us."

Voice #2: Today our Advent journey of waiting begins. We await the birth of the One who is called the Light of the World and the Hope of the Nations.

Voice #1: As we light the candle of Hope, we give thanks for the prophets of our day who dare to speak words of hope for liberation, who say "No" to the evil in the world and who call us to overcome our fear and to explore new visions of how things could be.

All: So many in your world, Holy God, have lost hope, or put their hope in false promises. Sometimes it feels you are not with us but are far, far, away. We pray that you come into our world again. Be Emmanuel for us; enter our hearts. Help us to live into your hope so we may be your light shining in the darkest places of the world.
